WHAT TO DO IN CASE OF A VEHICLE COLLISION

It's hard to think clearly after an accident. This checklist will help you remember what to do and collect the information you need for your insurance company and the police

- Attend to anyone who is hurt**
If there are serious injuries and immediate help is needed, call 911 or have someone do it for you.
- Move the vehicles to safety, if necessary.**
If it is unsafe to leave your vehicles where they are, try to move them. Otherwise, leave everything as is.
- Call the police.**
Even in a minor collision, it's important to have a legal accident report. Discuss the accident only with the police and your insurance company
- Take pictures.**
Document any damages, positions of vehicles, traffic and weather conditions, and anything else that could be relevant to the collision.
- Gather information.**
Exchange information with the other driver or drivers and collect contact information from possible witnesses.
- Document Details.**
Write down details such as time of day and events that led up to the collision.
